Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, in which the wise men come from the east and do homage to Him, as well as bring gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Although this is the most celebrated epiphany event, there are two other 'epiphanies' celebrated by the Church; the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, and the Wedding at Cana. These epiphanies are manifestations of the divine.

With respect to the gifts brought forth to the Infant Jesus, gold is a gift fitting for a king; frankincense is used for divine worship, and myrrh is a spice applied to the body in preparation for burial. The wise men are truly wise as they do homage to the King of Kings, who is divine, and who will suffer and die to redeem humanity. May we follow their lead in giving adoration and worship to the living God each time that we come to Mass. Let us also bring our gifts; our time, talent, and treasure; and especially our gifts of bread and wine which will become for us the Body and Blood of Christ. In turn, we receive the greatest gift of the Lord Himself, and live in His life.

As mentioned last Sunday, the Christmas season concludes with the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord on Monday, January 9<sup>th</sup>. Right after the 8:30 mass that morning, barring a funeral, all of the Christmas decorations will be taken down, and whoever wants to abscond with a poinsettia or two has our permission and blessing. If you would like to stick around and help with the cleanup operation, please feel free to do so.

Dear Parishioners:

Any family interested in pursuing tuition assistance through the diocese for the 2012-2013 school year should complete the necessary online process. The application may be accessed by visiting [www.factstuitionaid.com](http://www.factstuitionaid.com). This year, all applications must be completed online with required documents being mailed to FACTS. St. Andrew School will accommodate any family in need of internet use for this process. Please contact Mrs. Debbie Joseph, 614-451-1626, x155, to make arrangements for such accommodations. A \$25 application fee must accompany completed applications. Only one application is needed per family. The deadline for submission of completed tuition assistance materials is Thursday, March 15<sup>th</sup>.

Through the generosity of parishioners, St. Andrew is also able to offer tuition assistance in addition to the assistance provided by the diocese. However, families must apply for diocesan assistance in order to be considered for any parish tuition assistance. The application process, through the FACTS program, will help determine demonstrated need. The assistance provided will come from either diocesan funds, parish tuition assistance funds, or a combination of both sources.
