Dear Parishioners,

January is always a significant month of the year with regard to Respect Life activities. On the local front, this Sunday evening there will be the viewing of a movie, entitled "A Voice for Life," which tells the story of Melissa Ohden, whose life escaped the jaws of death of an intended abortion, and who has become a strong advocate for those waiting to be born, and a voice against abortion. This movie will be shown at the Eck Center, beginning at 7:00 p.m., and is sponsored by our Respect Life Society and our St. Andrew Council Knights of Columbus. All are invited. A free will offering will be taken and the proceeds will go to support local pregnancy crisis centers.

On the following Sunday, January 22nd, you are invited to gather in the church at 7:00 p.m. There, we will pray the living Rosary and ask the Lord and the Blessed Mother to protect and bless all those preparing to be born into the world, and for all mothers, especially those who are experiencing a stressful pregnancy.

On the diocesan and state level, on Monday, January 23rd, there be a mass at the Cathedral, which begins at 10:30, and which will be in observance of the Day of Prayer for the legal protection of Unborn Children. Following the Mass, at noon there will be a Rally for Life at the Ohio Statehouse West Plaza, sponsored by the Greater Columbus Right to Life. Since it is outdoors, please dress warmly for the occasion. These are great opportunities to take a stand for life.

On Sunday, January 29th, the annual Spaghetti Dinner will take place in the Parish Hall. Dinner will be served from 1:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. It is a change of pace in that for the previous years this event took place on a Saturday evening. The hope is that more dinners can be served during this time frame. To prepare for this wonderful event and serve it, many hands are needed. Please check out the flyer in this week's bulletin as to how you can get on board to volunteer as well as to eat.

Many thanks to Wally and Norma Johanni, Dave Miller, and Sheila O'Sullivan, who along with other volunteers, did a yeoman's job in taking down the Christmas decorations and restoring the church to the stark, but beautiful ordinary time look. Great job, everyone!

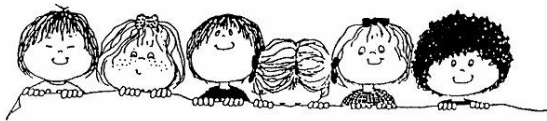


