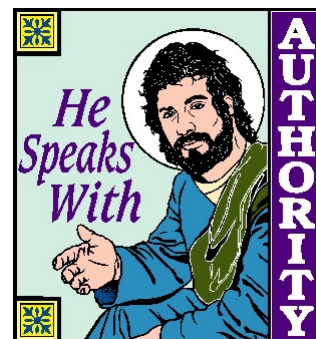

The Pastor's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

Wow, life is coming at us pretty fast. There is a lot of activity being packed into the parish life in the next several weeks. First, throughout the country this week is Catholic School's Week. We can celebrate the rich heritage and the legacy that been passed on in our country which began with St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, the foundress of the Sisters of Charity in the early 1800's and followed by St. John Neumann, the Archbishop of Philadelphia, who, in the 1850's, normalized schools being a part of parish life. Our school has been going strong since 1956, and today, from 1:00 to 3:00, there will be an Open House. Please check it out, and then afterward, head over to the Parish Hall for the annual spaghetti dinner, which will be served from 1:00 until 6:00 p.m. Also, at each mass, a second collection will be taken, and it will be directed to the tuition assistance fund, which provides a means to keep the cost of tuition affordable.

On Saturday evening, February 18th, a new offering to the parish will be provided by the Women's Club. Samplings of international cuisine will be offered by over 16 local vendors, and it will be held in the Parish Hall. It should be a very interesting and live experience. The Annual Women's and Men's Conferences will be held on back to back weekends of February 25th and March 3rd. Sign up information is in this bulletin. It is a wonderful opportunity for a spiritual shot in the arm.

Sandwiched between these events is our own Parish Mission, which will take place from February 26th through February 29th. It will be conducted by the Redemptorist Fathers, who regularly offered a Lenten Mission here during the time I was an Associate Pastor from 1990 to 1994.

They provide solid spiritual food for thought. They will preach at each of the masses during this time, as well as offer evening presentations, which will have a particular theme each night. On Tuesday evening, the theme will be the crucifix, and there will be the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Penance, as a number of Confessors will be present. The mission will conclude on Wednesday evening with mass. It provides, in the comfort of our own church and community, an opportunity to experience the Word made flesh among us, and to live out the mission to better know, love, and serve God each day of life.

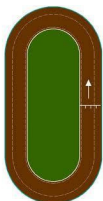
