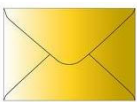

**CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS OF CATHOLICS**

St. Andrew Respect Life Society urgently requests all the lay faithful of our community to **respond to the recent mandate issued by the US Department of Health and Human Services** which disregards our Catholic faith to practice our Constitutional Rights of Religious Freedom and Conscience. There are many ways in which you can make your voice heard. First of all, **pray and fast for a change of hearts and policy**. Second, **contact your U.S. Senators and Representatives** and inform them that you want them to support the **Respect for Rights and Conscience Act** (H.R. 1179, S. 1467). This measure will ensure that those who participate in the health care system **“retain the right to provide, purchase, or enroll in health coverage that is consistent with their religious beliefs and moral convictions.”** It is more important than ever that Members of Congress be urged to co-sponsor this measure. 
