**LENTEN OBSERVANCES:**

**Fasting** is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to each one's needs, but eating any food between meals is not permitted.

**Abstinence** from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years or older on Good Friday. Eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat are permitted.

**Confessions** will be heard on Monday and Wednesday from 4:30 to 5:30, and from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. On Good Friday, you may receive the sacrament from 1:30 to 2:45 p.m., and following the **3:00 p.m. Good Friday Liturgy**. Lastly, you can still go to confession on the same day, Good Friday, following the **Stations of the Cross**, which will be prayed at 7:30 p.m.

**The Pastor's Corner**

Dear Parishioners,

We enter the holiest week of the Church, beginning with this Palm Sunday. It is a time to be present to the mystery of Christ as we remember and celebrate His passion, death, and glorious resurrection. In doing so, Christ becomes more alive in our hearts, and we are filled with the divine presence. The events of the Mass of the Lord's Supper, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil are referred to as the Sacred Triduum. The liturgies during this time are done beautifully and beckon the soul to be close to Christ. May we take time to make time with the Lord, so to prepare more dearly for eternal time in heaven. To prepare your soul through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, opportunities abound. This Monday and Wednesday, from 4:30 to 5:30 and 7 to 8 p.m., you may receive this sacrament. On Good Friday, confessions will be heard from 1:30 to 2:45, and after the 3 p.m. Good Friday Liturgy; as well as after the conclusion of the Stations of the Cross, which will be prayed at 7:30.

You are invited to get the church ready for Easter by showing up Monday morning after mass. All you have to provide is some elbow grease as buckets and cloth rags will be in abundant supply. This cleaning venture is not just open to women, but can also be seen as a guy thing. Also, on Holy Saturday morning at 9:00, the church will be decorated in the splendor of Easter. Thanks to DeSantis Florists and Strader's Garden Centers, we will be graced with a lovely supply of spring flowers, especially fragrant lilies. Your volunteer help is being solicited.

Later that morning, at 11:00 a.m., there will be a blessing of Easter baskets that contain traditional Easter foods (no chocolate bunnies or jelly beans). I can get paid in extra kielbasa.

Lastly, please mark your calendars on Sunday, May 15<sup>th</sup>, in which I will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at 3:00 p.m., on the occasion of my 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Ordination to the Priesthood. A reception will be held afterward in the Parish Hall, catered by Berwick Manor. A general invite is elsewhere in this bulletin. I am extremely grateful to be a priest, and to serve at this parish. I hope you can be there.

Hear the words of absolution.

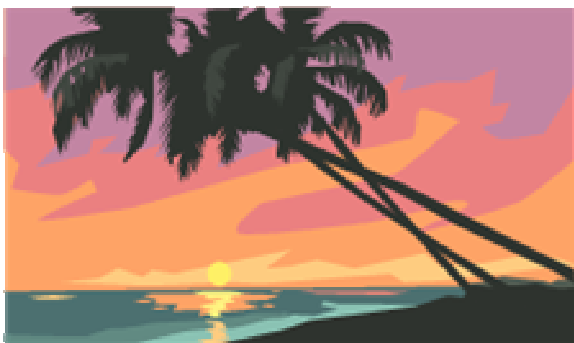

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### HOW CAN A GIFT COST LESS THAN ANOTHER GIFT?

Giving appreciated property such as real estate or securities instead of cash can reduce the "cost" of a gift.
