My Dear Friends,

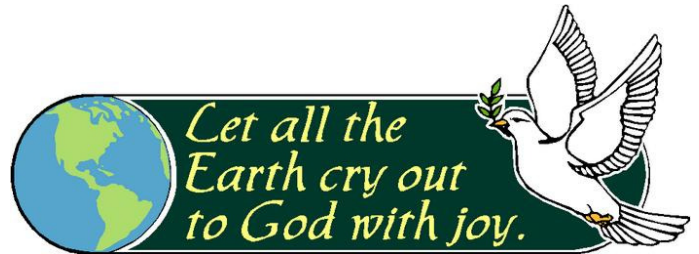

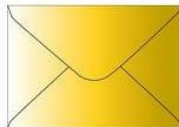

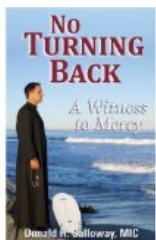

The developing baby is now called a "fetus", which is Latin for "little one." She is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month, baby teeth form, and fingers and toes are developing. Her ears, nose, lips and tongue can now be clearly seen. Brain waves can be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning, and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks, all body systems are present. This little one can now suck her thumb.

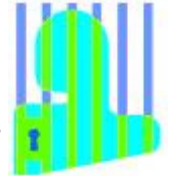
