PSR REGISTRATION FOR 2011-12:

Registration forms for next year's Parish School of Religion have been mailed to families who were registered in the program this past year. This includes families who had children registered in the Sunday morning Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program. The forms will be posted on the St. Andrew Parish website, also, for those new to the parish or those who will be new to the program next year.

Classes for grades 1-5 are held on Wednesdays from 4:30-5:45 p.m. **Classes for grades 6, 7, and 8** meet on Sunday evenings from 6:45-8:00 p.m. Both sessions are held at the St. Andrew School building.

Tuition for next year remains at \$185 per child. A discount of twenty dollars may be taken for each child if registered by August 15th. Registrations must be postmarked August 15th if mailed or must be received in the office by August 15th in order for the discount to be applied.

Charity and Social Justice



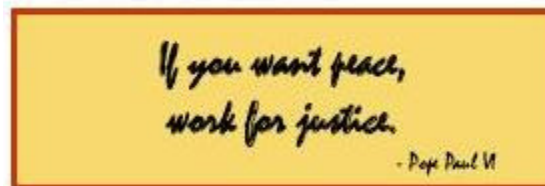
If we're paying attention, we hear and read stories of homelessness, gross disparity in income, inadequate health care, ecological disaster, child hunger... the list goes on. Though we wish to be insulated from all this pain and suffering, we're forced to admit its reality.

Interestingly enough, a phrase that had fallen upon hard times is starting to be used again: "*the common good.*" It is at the heart of Catholic social justice teaching. It means "*the sum total of social conditions that allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily*" (Catechism #1906). Related to social justice, the common good judges a society not by how the wealthiest – the Oprah Winfreys and Bill Gateses – are doing, but by how well the poor are faring. As we look around the world, it's not a pretty picture. A rich resource calling our families to become communities of justice is scripture. Be forewarned, however: It will make us a bit uncomfortable.

This is reinforced by Jesus in Matthew's gospel (chapter 25) when he lays out the conditions of the Kingdom: Feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, care for the ill, and visit the imprisoned. But when, we ask Jesus, did we see you in these states? To which he replies: "Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me."

Another important point is to distinguish between charity and social justice. Charity includes those acts – donating food to a food pantry, volunteering at a homeless shelter, giving money to Catholic Relief Services – that are privately, or individually, done and that address concrete and immediate needs. Acting for social justice – campaigning against the death penalty, working to change the policies of the government or businesses – speak to public and long-term concerns. Charity is often very rewarding personally; justice, however, can lead to tension and is often more controversial. As Christians we are called to both.
