Dear Parishioners,

As we begin the second half of the year, we are now preparing for the changes that will occur at mass beginning the First Sunday of Advent with the implementation of the new translation of the Roman Missal. Our Deacon, Tom Berg, who also serves as Vice Chancellor of the Diocese and is in charge of Communications, is offering a series of columns in the bulletin, which provides background for the new Roman Missal, and the changes themselves. This column will be alongside my column, as it deserves front page space. The hope of what will transpire is that this will be an enlightening experience to deepen our understanding of the mass and why we say what we say and do what we do, so that our worship will be more meaningful and fruitful. In August, I will send a letter out to all parishioners, along with material about the changes.

On behalf of Fr. Sibi Kunninu and the LaSalette Missionaries, I would like to thank you for your generous response to his appeal last weekend. Thus far, \$8,657 has been received. A portion of this money, 10%, will go to the Missions Office of the Diocese of Columbus, which supports the missionary work at the local level. Our new Parochial Vicar (Associate Pastor), newly-ordained **Fr. Tyron Tomson**, is now on board. THE ROMAN MISSAL — From Latin to English, part 2

The intended effect of the new English translation of the Roman Missal that will be introduced this November is to effect a greater consistency of the faith that is proclaimed in the Mass with that of the original text and throughout the world.

One of the elements of the new translation that stands in obvious contrast from what we are accustomed to using is the more formal manner by which words and phrases are framed. This is the result of a number of factors. There was an intentional choice to underscore the uniquely dignified act of worship that we gather to make which warrants the use of language that is more formal than everyday language usage. This will be particularly apparent in the parts that are spoken by the priests.

The new translation will also have phrases that more closely reflect the original scriptural basis, which has become obscured somewhat in the translation we have been using. Also, some of the terminology will introduce words that we are not generally accustomed to using but which more accurately present the truths of the Catholic faith. In the weeks ahead, we will examine these new words in more detail.

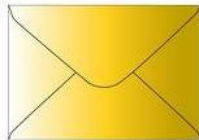

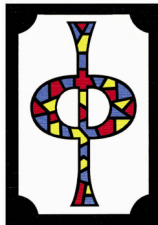
