Deacon's Corner

Dear Parishioners,

Father Watson is traveling once again this week, so I will be filling in for him here. Please keep him and all the clergy of the parish in your prayers, that we are strengthened by our Lord as we strive to serve Him and all His people.

As you have probably heard by now, October is Respect Life Month in the Catholic Church, which calls us to live a consistent ethic of life, an ethic that protects all human life from conception to natural death. This can indeed be quite a challenge in our lives. We are called to face "conventional wisdoms" that denigrate the value of human life in many different ways, whether it is legalized abortion, pushes to legalize euthanasia, the death penalty, embryonic stem cell research, and so forth. But we must remember, as St. Paul wrote, that the Lord's ways are not the world's ways. We are called to have courage and take other paths, to courageously support the value and preciousness of all God's people, regardless of their state in life.

In taking a stand for life, we are also called to continue to educate ourselves about life issues as well. A good place to start learning more is the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' human life and dignity and pro-life pages: www.usccb.org/issues-and-action/human-life-and-dignity/ and www.usccb.org/about/pro-life-activities/respect-life-program/. The parish bulletin also runs information on these matters, such as the Spiritual Adoption column or the advertisement for the human life amendment seminar at St. Matthew's in Gahanna. Take some time this week to check all these out and learn more on the topic of respect for life.

Another important matter in our parish life this month is ongoing efforts regarding membership and activities. If you have not yet done so, stop by the parish directory table for a minute to make sure your listing in the directory is up to date. Also take some time to review the many opportunities for getting involved that are advertised around St. Andrew's, whether it be Habitat for Humanity, the Youth Group, the Young Ladies of the Parish, the Knights of Columbus, the Women's Club buckeyes project, and many more. There are many, many opportunities to be involved and active here at our parish.

Caring Spirit Support Group

The Caring Spirit Support Group offers men and women of our parish a great opportunity for Stewardship, by serving our senior parishioners who are temporarily home-bound, and without caretaker services. We provide short support visits to assist them with household activities, as well as the comfort of a visit from a caring parishioner. All visits are confidential.

Those senior parishioners just home from the hospital or recovering from a debilitating illness, temporarily home-bound and without caretaker services, and unable to perform certain activities, are eligible for our support services. Some examples of our assistance include taking garbage out, doing laundry, brief errands, sweeping, watering flowers and houseplants, and dropping off medication prescriptions. Also, the senior parishioner may need supportive listening, encouragement and prayer.

If you are a senior parishioner or know of a senior parishioner who is temporarily home-bound and without caretaker services, and who would appreciate assistance from Caring Spirit volunteers, contact the Caring Spirit Voice Mailbox at the Parish Office 451-1129, Extension 123. The Voice Mail messages will be monitored, and a Caring Spirit volunteer will get back to you as soon as possible.

If you are interested in becoming a Caring Spirit volunteer, we meet on a regular basis to plan, share, and pray together with the goal of personal spiritual growth through stewardship to St. Andrew's senior parishioners in need. ♪ SINGING A NEW SONG ♪

As we have heard and read for quite some time now, the new translation of the Roman Missal will be implemented in all parishes throughout the United States on the First Sunday of Advent, November 26th-27th. In preparation for the full implementation, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, along with our own local Bishop, Frederick Campbell, have given permission to gradually introduce the sung portions of the new translation beginning in October. This wisely allows all of us time to become familiar with a significant portion of the new texts and melodies before the new spoken texts are introduced in late November.

At the recommendation of the Bishop, we will be singing the Mass in Honor of St. Benedict. In order to learn this new Mass setting in a relatively short period of time, we will briefly review a portion of the music before weekend liturgies for the next several weeks. While some of us may not prefer such rehearsals, they are a necessary part of the transition process for this short time. Additionally, there will also be an opportunity for parishioners to attend a special session with the choir on Thursday evening, October 20th, from 7:00 to 7:30 p.m., to help you become more familiar with this new Mass setting.

Thank you in advance for your patience, flexibility, and openness as all of us make this important transition together.

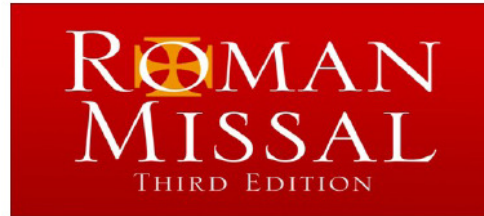

A SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION
At its heart, the Eucharist is a sacrament of communion bringing the people closer to God and to one another in the Body of Christ. By living the fruits of the Eucharist in daily life, families and communities are filled with the life-giving qualities the Mass brings: hospitality, concern for the poor and vulnerable, self-offering, and thanksgiving.

An ancient saying in the Church reads "*lex orandi, lex credendi*," meaning: "as we pray, so we believe." In the third edition of the *Roman Missal*, the bishops and translators took great care to ensure that the prayers accurately and fully reflect the mysteries of the faith. Thus, the words prayed will help to form and strengthen understanding of the faith.

The effects of the Mass should not stop at the doors of the church. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches that the Eucharist fosters union with Christ, avoidance of sin, increased charity, stronger communion among all, and recognition of Christ in the poorest and most vulnerable (CCC 1391-1397). What does that mean in daily life?

LIVING A LIFE OF PRAYER
The richer prayer is throughout the week, the more fully people will enter into the Sunday Mass. Here are some ways to make daily life more prayerful:

- * Try attending daily Mass at least once a week.
- * Stop in a church for 15 minutes of quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle.
- * Strive to say grace before every meal.
- * Schedule time for family prayer at least once a week. This prayer can be as simple as saying the Our Father or a decade of the Rosary together.
- * Take time during the week to read or listen to the readings for the coming Sunday.
