**ST. ANDREW SCHOOL FIELD TRIP  
TO STONE LABORATORY**

The Eighth Grade class at St. Andrew Catholic School took an overnight field trip on September 22<sup>nd</sup>-23<sup>rd</sup> to Stone Laboratory on Gibraltar Island in Lake Erie. The trip was a first-time experience for any group of students at the school, and it gave the students the rare and coveted chance to study Lake Erie for 2 days.

The students were divided into smaller groups, and each group was given the opportunity to spend 2 hours on a research vessel on Lake Erie, doing the hands-on work of a scientist, in which they collected environmental and biological data, such as wind speed and direction, water depth, temperature, wave heights, plankton, fish, and other important details pertaining to Lake Erie.

After their time on the Science Cruise, the groups convened in the lab for another two hours where they conducted in-depth research on plankton and fish present in Lake Erie. They examined the biology of aquatic ecosystems, food pyramids, and examined live phytoplankton and zooplankton under compound microscopes. The groups also learned fish identification techniques, using a dichotomous key to determine the identity of selected families of fish. The session ended with a fish dissection to examine internal organs, stomach contents, parasites, and/or diseases.

The students participated in an invertebrate walk on Gibraltar Island's Alligator Bar, a rocky shoal, which, through their research, resulted in them being able to calculate a score that determined local water quality. The class also collected insects and took an ornithology hike to study the birds native to Gibraltar Island.

The class was housed overnight at the Harborview dormitory and Barney Cottage on Gibraltar Island.

Stone Laboratory is owned and operated by The Ohio State University and is integral to the study of Lake Erie. The students at St. Andrew appreciated this wonderful opportunity that enhanced their science curriculum outside of the classroom in such a unique and memorable way. St. Andrew hopes to continue the experience for future eighth grade classes.
