Dear Parishioners,

As mentioned in last week's bulletin, the month of November is a time to remember those who have gone before us. We honored the Church Triumphant on the Feast of All Saints, and remembered and prayed for the Church Suffering on the Feast of All Souls. Those who are in this condition are waiting to be received into the fullness of everlasting life, and seek our prayers. On one end there is a joyful hope that is being more realized in this state of further purification, or Purgatory; as one is closer to God. Being closer to God deepens the desire to be in the fullness of God, and that absence makes the heart grow fonder. Special ways of assisting our deceased loved ones are to keep them in prayer, and by having masses offered for the repose of their souls. Also, during this month the Book of the Dead will be placed in the vestibule which lists the 55 people who have died from the parish since last November. You are invited to add to this book your deceased loved ones. Lastly, on Sunday, November 20th, at 3:00 there will a lovely remembrance service offered by the choirs of St. Andrew's, under the direction of Music Director Phil Lortz. It is a wonderful time to gather, remember, and pray for the dead. May they be raised to everlasting life and peace in the Lord.

This program has already been established at eight other parishes in the diocese, and the purpose is to better respond to a variety of student learning needs for students who are at St. Andrew School and/or Parish School of Religion.
