PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

I am sure you are all concerned about the devastation and destruction caused by Hurricane Harvey to our brothers and sisters who have lost homes and property and are enduring much suffering from the flooding, wind and unprecedented rainfall. You can help! Please give generously to the Special Collection at all masses this weekend (September 9/10) which will be given to Catholic Charities USA for relief to the victims. Thank you for your generous response.

Next weekend (September 16/17) I will speak briefly at all masses to encourage all parishioners to recommit their support for St. Andrew Parish offertory, and to Enriching our Faith and Strengthening our Church. You will be receiving something in the mail about this. I am still very grateful for your generous response to last year's offertory enhancement effort; I simply want to remind everyone of the importance of keeping these commitments strong and steady.

Thursday of this week (September 14) is the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Although this feast originally commemorated both the discovery of the True Cross by St. Helena (the mother of the Roman emperor Constantine) in the early fourth century, and the dedication of the church that was built over the site of the Lord's crucifixion, this feast is a reminder to us that the Cross of the Lord is our salvation and our hope. As Jesus has solemnly taught us in the gospel we heard last Sunday: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow after me." As Christ carried his cross and fell beneath its burden, and was nailed to it, and died upon it, but was raised up and greatly exalted by God and given the name above all other names—so we too must carry the cross of suffering in life, whatever form it may take, so that we also may be exalted with Christ. May we be reminded of this whenever we make the sign of the cross, or whenever we see the image of the cross displayed in our homes, on church towers or steeples, on pendants that are worn on a chain around our neck or on a pin in our lapel. The cross is a constant presence in the life of every Christian, from beginning to end. Catechumens are presented with a cross as they go through the process of conversion and repentance. Infants are signed with the cross and claimed for Christ as they are about to be baptized. A crucifix is placed on the casket of the deceased as the body is brought into Church. May we claim as our only glory the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ!

"We adore you O Christ, and We praise you, Because, by your Holy Cross, you have redeemed the world!"

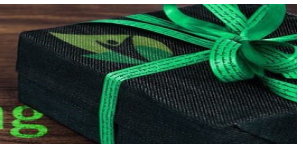
