**PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Parishioners:

This coming Monday (September 4) is Labor Day, a national holiday which celebrates the importance and dignity of workers, and the contribution workers make to the achievements, prosperity and success of our country. As Catholics, Labor Day is also an opportunity to reflect upon the dignity of human work and the dignity of workers. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that human work is a continuation of God's work in creation. Work is a duty, as St. Paul says, "If anyone will not work, let him not eat" (2 Thess 3:10). We must use the gifts and talents God has given us, and thus fulfill the potential written in our human nature. Work must not be done only for the sake of profit, but to benefit people and society. Workers must be paid fairly; discrimination in employment must be avoided. Society must help citizens find employment so they may support themselves and their families (see CCC# 2426-2436).

The Catholic Church has been the ally of workers especially since the days of the Industrial Revolution, beginning with the Encyclical of Pope Leo XIII, Rerum Novarum which was issued in 1891. The work that we do can be a means of our own sanctification, especially if we bear its hardships in union with Christ. Our work can be our extension of Christ's redemptive work, as we seek to build the Kingdom of God on earth, even as we await the coming of the heavenly Kingdom. Finally, let us remember that work is God's gift to us. Like the owner of the vineyard in the parable told by Jesus, he sends us to work in his vineyard, he assigns our tasks and pays us what is more than fair. Let us then fulfill our work with joy, for we are doing God's will.
