PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we observe the feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. This feast was traditionally celebrated on January 6, the "twelfth day" of Christmas (and in some countries it still is) but in the American Church we celebrate Epiphany on the Sunday closest to January 6. We used to call Epiphany "Little Christmas." Because the Magi brought gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh to the Christ child. This feast is an occasion for giving and exchanging gifts in some cultures. The figures of the "three kings" are customarily placed in the nativity scene at Epiphany.

I confess that I have a weakness for nativity sets. I have collected about a dozen of them over the years. My favorite is a set of inexpensive figures I bought when I was a student in Rome in 1987. A few years later I was doing some after-Christmas shopping with my sister at the Jeffersonville Outlet Mall and saw a beautiful set of nativity figures at the Bombay Co. store. They were marked down 75% off, but I did not buy them because I reasoned that I already had a nativity set. I always regretted that decision. From then on, I have been on the lookout for beautiful and interesting Nativity sets – especially if it is at a bargain price!

Usually, we display our Nativity sets only during the Christmas Season. But a few weeks ago when I set out my Nativity scene (or one of them anyway), I began to wonder: why shouldn't we display the Nativity all year round? After all, we display the crucifix in our homes, classrooms and Church all year. We don't first put it up on Good Friday. We display the crucifix and reverence it so that we are always aware that Christ died to save us and redeem us. But his birth was also for our salvation. "For us men and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man." We would do well to contemplate his solidarity with us and our human condition all year by contemplating his nativity, just as we contemplate his sacrificial death for our salvation by keeping his cross before us at all times. Think about it! Don't be in a rush to put your nativity figures away till next year!

May God bless you all these cold winter days!
