**PASTOR'S CORNER**

Dear Parishioners:

I am certain that you were all as shocked as I was to hear of the horrible killings last Sunday of 26 worshippers by a gunman at a small church in Sutherland Springs, Texas. The fact that this latest mass shooting took place in a church sanctuary, a supposedly holy, peaceful and safe place, makes this senseless bloodshed that much more distressing. If people are not safe in Church on a bright Sunday morning, where else can they go to be safe? We all have to wonder, "Could this happen here, at St. Andrew?" Certainly, we have to think about what was once unthinkable. The truth is, the Church is vulnerable because we are intentionally open and welcoming. Our doors are open, we invite all to come inside. As the Lord himself said, "My house shall be called a house of prayer for all people." (Is.56:7) Precisely because of this, we must not consider turning the church into an inaccessible fortress. But we must be concerned about safety and security. We must be alert to danger, be aware of our surroundings, and report any suspicious activity. It was once considered a sacrilege to even bring a weapon through the doors of the church. It would hardly be fitting to the holiness of the place to station armed guards around the Church, or to have everyone pass through a security check in order to come into Church. Let us ask our strong and mighty Lord to shield us from all harm and thwart the plans of anyone who would hurt us. And let us pray that God may grant eternal life to all the victims of this violence.

On another matter, I want to take this opportunity to thank you for your response to the offertory renewal program back in September. Many of you renewed your existing commitment to the offertory, and quite a few even increased your giving. I received several notes from parishioners explaining that they were unable to increase their giving because of their financial circumstances. I certainly would not want anyone to think they should give more than they can afford. As St. Paul told the Corinthians, "Your generosity to others ought not to impoverish you." I do want us all to be thoughtful and intentional about our giving, which is the reason for my asking that we at least think about and renew our commitment to the offertory annually. Thank all of you for your thoughtful stewardship and generous support of St. Andrew Parish.
