PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

I hope that your Lent is off to a good start! This Sunday is the Second Sunday of Lent, and we have already completed 10 of the 40 penitential days of this holy season. It may be that already your fervor and zeal with which you began the season on Ash Wednesday is beginning to wane. Perhaps you are already compromising or becoming careless about your Lenten promises and resolutions. Perhaps you are falling back into the same sinful habits you renounced and repented of on Ash Wednesday. If so, do not become discouraged! Rather, begin again, asking the Lord to give you strength and perseverance. Our failure to keep our Lenten promises teaches us how weak we are and how much we need to rely on the Lord's strength rather than our own. And at the same time, the keeping of our resolutions should not be something we take selfish pride in, as if it were our own accomplishment. Do not forget – "pride goeth before a fall." Perhaps it is better if we sometimes fail to keep all of our Lenten resolutions, because that will at least keep us humble.

I remind you that the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat for all Catholics over age 14. An excellent way to keep this penitential obligation is by partaking of St. Andrew Friday Fish Dinners! The food is plentiful and delicious. Please see more details elsewhere in the bulletin.

As you have heard, the telephone service at the Parish Office was interrupted. This has made me realize how important it is to be connected, to be able to communicate with others. The absence of this access is more than an inconvenience, but it also helps me to realize that accepting inconveniences and losses without complaining is also a penitential act and an attitude of humility. I recommend it.

Finally, I want to call attention to the upcoming Day of Appreciation and Renewal for Liturgical Ministers, which will take place on Sunday, March 19 beginning at 2:30 p.m. in Nugent Parish Hall. This is intended for all St. Andrew liturgical ministers: Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Choir and Cantors, Ushers and Greeters, both current and aspiring. The day includes refreshments, a keynote address for all gathered, and break-out sessions for ongoing practice and improving skills for each individual ministry. I will be presenting the keynote address this year on the subject "The Vocation of the Laity." Let me take this opportunity also to express my thanks and appreciation to all lay liturgical ministers for their faithfulness and for their excellent service, which helps to make our liturgies at St. Andrew welcoming, meaningful, smoothly efficient and beautiful to the Glory of God!

He works through the man to give him sight. He encounters the man with love. Who is my neighbor? We might ask. To whom should I reach out and give them hope that they are dignified human beings worthy of love? Jesus replies with the Parable of the Good Samaritan – and it becomes clear that he is intent on building an inclusive society, one that is formed in the image of God's vision for us. *Remember to keep filing your rice bowl!*
