PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

Today we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, often called the "birthday of the Church," because it was on Pentecost that the Holy Spirit was given to the Apostles and they overcame their fear and began to proclaim the Gospel boldly to all. The same Holy Spirit, which we received in Baptism and more fully in Confirmation, equips each of us to carry out our Christian calling. As the hymn we sing says, "The Spirit sends us forth to serve, we go in Jesus' name! God's Spirit has empowered us, we go in Jesus' name!"

A few weeks ago, I told you about giving a tour of the church to the 4th grade PSR class, and promised I would give more details, so I shall do so today. One of the students asked about the brass strip that goes down the middle of the center aisle of the church. He asked rather bluntly "what's that?" The brass strip runs all the way down the center aisle, to the back of the sanctuary, on a north-south axis. There is another brass strip that crosses it on an east-west axis. The two straight lines intersect in the center of the sanctuary, directly beneath the center of the altar. Thus, the whole of the church is laid out on a cross, the sign of our salvation. Furthermore, at the point of intersection beneath the altar is a brass marker where the relics of the saints are placed. This was done when the church and altar were dedicated, and follows an ancient tradition of the church that goes back to the time of persecution when the Eucharist was celebrated "underground," in the catacombs, literally upon the tombs of the martyrs. So now you know the significance of the brass strip in the center aisle!

I want to remind you of the availability of an abundance of Catholic books, movies, videos, study materials and inspirational products accessible for FREE from FORMED. I especially want to recommend the three-part series on the Holy Eucharist called "Presence." It is a truly profound presentation on the power and mystery of the Most Holy Eucharist, a fine way to prepare for the feast of Corpus Christi just three weeks away.
