As we approach mid-June and the summer solstice, the days grow longer, the sun rises early in the morning and sets late in the evening. The sun is high in the sky, almost directly overhead. Its light illuminates the whole sky and makes the earth shine in beauty. The blue sky, the white clouds, the green grass, the many colored flowers, every creature on earth has a dazzling splendor. 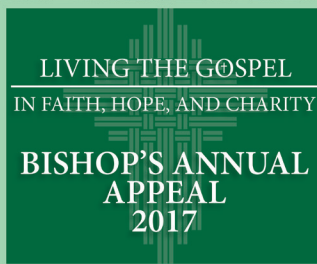
