PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

Passing on the faith from one generation to the next is a difficult responsibility. I'm thinking especially of the older generations who were adults at the time of Vatican II (1962-65). They had the tremendous task of preserving, adapting, and reshaping the way Catholics lived. Some embraced Vatican II and some were hesitant about it. Regardless of their personal preferences, many of them still valued their Catholic faith enough to pass it on to their children. They sent them to Catholic Schools, taught them to have strong Catholic morals, and most of all, wanted them to go to Mass and have their own children baptized. Looking back, I think it is true that something went wrong. So many middle-aged people who grew up Catholic stopped practicing their Catholic faith. I hesitate to blame anyone for this simply because there were too many factors involved.

While we are still working out the details of the transition from the older generations to the middle generations, Pope Francis has called us to move on. In October 2018, he has planned a 'Synod of Bishops' to gather and discuss the topic of the youth. The official title is 'On Young People, the Faith, and Vocational Discernment.' By youth, he means those 16-29. He sees this as an opportunity for the Church "to examine herself on how she can lead young people to recognize and accept the call to the fullness of life and love, and to ask young people to help her in identifying the most effective way to announce the Good News today." Let us start praying for this event now and that the truly pastoral bishops (not the careerists) may be invited.

Passing on the faith to my generation (I still fit in this category!) will be a challenge, but I am glad that it is on the radar. I often wonder what the Catholic Church will look like 10, 25 and 50 years from now. I see myself as being somewhere 'in between.' As a priest, I have a profound respect for all of the older generations and their commitment to the Catholic heritage. But as a young Catholic, I also push myself to try to make the message more credible and less exclusive.

In spite of it all, I look forward to the future. This past week, we had over 200 people involved in our SACRED program (Vacation Bible School) at St. Andrew. This included St. Andrew School students, PSR students, friends, young adult leaders, station leaders, and program organizers. A big thanks to all of them. If this is the next generation of Catholics we are off to a great start!

Remember that Msgr. Moloney is away this week. Please don't bring anything too serious to me this week....I don't want to have to call him for advice and interrupt his time away!
