A NOTE FROM OUR SEMINARIAN

Dear Parishioners:

My name is Michael Haemmerle and I am the seminarian who has been assigned to spend the summer here at St. Andrew Parish. Msgr. Moloney has graciously allowed me use of his pastor's column this week to introduce myself.

I am the oldest of five children; I have one brother and three sisters. I am from the small town of Carroll, which is near Lancaster. I was homeschooled through high school. My family belongs to Saint Patrick in Columbus. I graduated from Ohio State with my degree in mechanical engineering last May. The first time I thought about the priesthood was during Adoration when I was in 8th grade. I continued to think about the priesthood through high school. I even visited the Josephinum for a discernment weekend. However, I didn't think God was calling me to seminary just yet. While at OSU, I was very involved with Saint Paul's Outreach, a Catholic student group active with the Newman Center in campus ministry. I am very excited to be here this summer and to get to know all of you. I am thankful for this opportunity to see parish life from a new perspective. In the short time I have been here, many of you have already been so welcoming and kind. I ask that you pray for me and my brother seminarians and know that I will be praying for you.
