PASTOR'S COLUMN

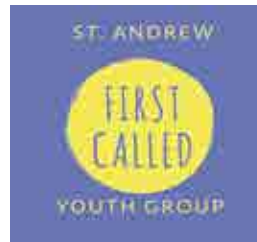
Dear Parishioners:
