PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners:

For the last several weeks, the Gospel reading at Sunday Mass has been taken from the Gospel according to John. This will continue through the rest of this month. We are in the midst of "Year B" of the Lectionary cycle of Sunday readings, and the Gospel readings mostly come from the Gospel of Mark, except for these few Sundays when we hear these passages from John. During these weeks, the Gospel readings are taken from the sixth chapter of John, which contains Jesus' "Bread of Life" discourse. This is something that is unique to the Gospel of John, and there is no parallel in the other gospels. Hearing the words of Jesus as He declares: "I am the bread of life, whoever eats this bread will live forever," reminds us of the reason the celebration of Mass and receiving the Body and Blood of Christ in Holy Communion is the most important thing we do as Catholics. It is the center of our lives, the source and fountain of grace. Jesus emphasizes the reality of the Sacrament when He says "My flesh is true food and my blood is true drink." He is definitely not speaking of mere symbolic representation when he says, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day."

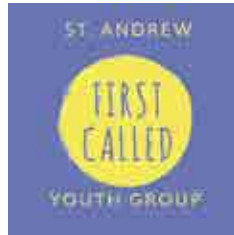
The Church in her wisdom presents the entire Bread of Life discourse of Jesus over five Sundays, so that we may be reminded by Jesus' own words and teaching that the Most Holy Eucharist is truly and really the Body and Blood of Christ, the food of eternal life. May we always hunger for the Bread of Life!

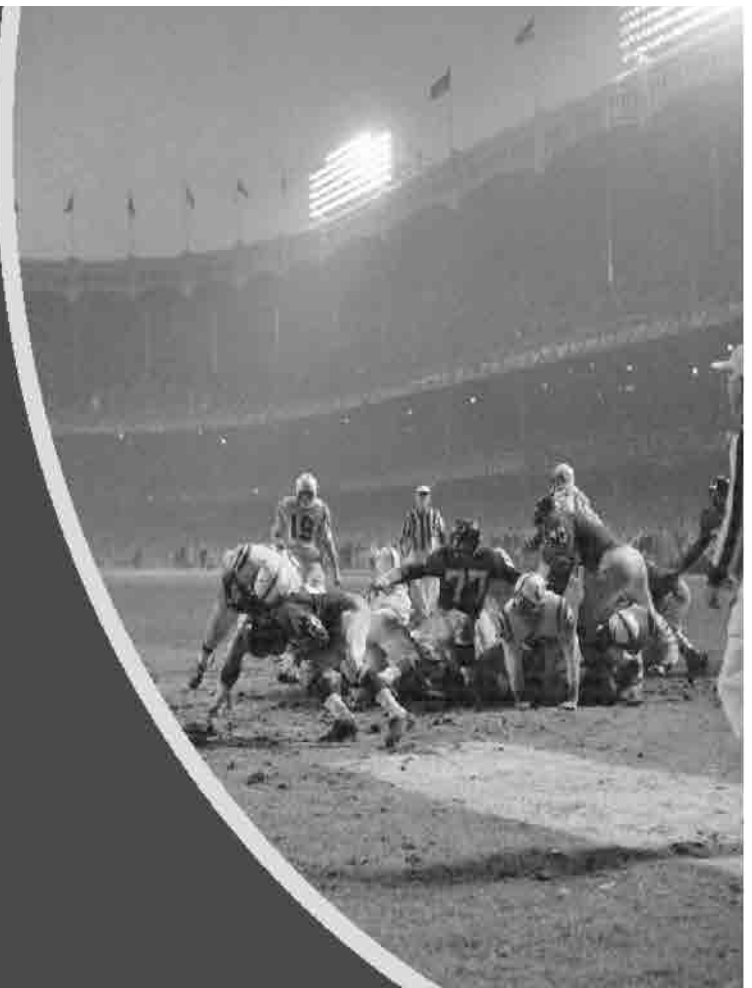
