PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend is a holiday weekend, as Monday, September 3 is Labor Day. As I prepare this message on Tuesday, August 28, I have just finished preparing the readings for tomorrow's Mass. As I was reading and reflecting on the first reading from 2 Thessalonians 3:6-10, 16-18, it struck me that that passage is an excellent message for Labor Day. St. Paul emphasizes to the Thessalonians that they must live orderly lives, working hard to earn the food they eat. He gives himself as an example, saying that when he lived among the people, he worked hard "in toil and drudgery" so as not to be a burden to anyone. He did not want to be seen as a freeloader by having people provide him with food for free.

We also should be thankful for our work by which we support ourselves and our families. We should work hard, fulfilling our duties with care, not cheating our employer by our idleness or non-productivity. We earn our remuneration honestly by our labor. If we are retired, we have earned the benefits of retirement through a lifetime of honest work completed. St. Paul invited the Thessalonians to imitate his example of hard work and striving to avoid being a burden to anyone.

We should be thankful for our work, and for our ability to work and support ourselves, especially when we know there are those who, while willing to work, are without it. Let us show our gratitude by joyfully undertaking our work, remaining busy and dutiful, and diligently applying ourselves until every task is complete and every obligation fulfilled. Happy Labor Day!

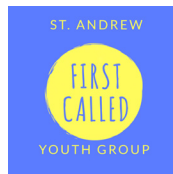
