**PASTOR'S COLUMN**

Dear Parishioners:

Often, as I am greeting people after Sunday Masses here at St. Andrew, I may say to them, "Happy Sunday!" and "Have a good week!" Sunday is indeed a special day – it is the first day of the week, the Lord's day, the day the church gathers to celebrate the paschal mystery, the day when Christ rose from the dead. It is a day dedicated to God, and to the renewal of ourselves in body and spirit. But, we should not compartmentalize our lives such that Sunday is the only day we tend to spiritual matters, to prayer, worship, reflection and renewal. A "happy Sunday" should be the beginning of a "good week," a week in which each and every day is sanctified by prayer and good works, in which each day is dedicated and offered to God, in which we strive to grow in the knowledge and love of God, to keep His commandments, to trust Him more completely, surrender ourselves to Him more fully. That reminds me of the song from the musical *Godspell*:

*"Day by day  
O dear Lord, these things I pray  
To see thee more clearly  
Love thee more dearly  
Follow thee more nearly  
Day by day!"*

So, keep this in mind when I wish you a "Happy Sunday" and a "Good Week!"

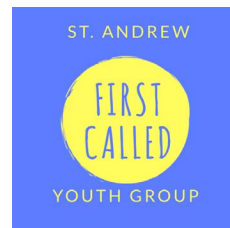
