**PASTOR'S COLUMN**

Dear Parishioners:

It is not easy to be a Catholic – at least to be a good Catholic. Even in the best of times, our faith challenges us to live holy and upright lives, fulfilling God’s commandments, following in the footsteps of Jesus our Savior while shouldering His cross; loving our neighbor as ourselves, fulfilling all the duties of our state in life; being honest and truthful; working for justice and peace; seeking purity of heart; helping the poor; giving of our time, talent and treasure to support our Church; fulfilling our obligation by attending Mass every Sunday and Holy Days; keeping the Eucharistic fast; observing days of penance; keeping the Church’s laws on marriage; sanctifying each day through prayer; and most difficult of all, loving our enemies. How much more difficult it is to be a good Catholic in time of upheaval, disturbance, ridicule and persecution.

I can clearly remember being in catechism class as a child preparing for my First Communion. Our class met in the choir loft of our little church of Our Lady of Lourdes in Ada. Our pastor, Fr. Francis Schweitzer, taught us that we must always be proud to be Catholic! He taught us that such pride was not the same as the sin of pride, that caused Adam and Eve to be banished from Paradise – but rather our pride in being Catholic means we should never hide our Catholic identity, or be embarrassed by it. I have never forgotten this, and even in difficult times such as the present, I continue to be proud to be Catholic. I hope you will, too.

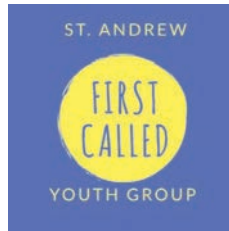

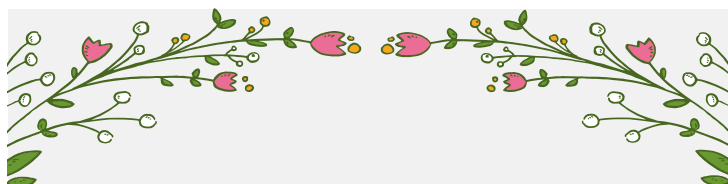
**EPIC: A Journey through Church History
