PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners:

The election season of 2018 is upon us. The general election takes place on Tuesday, November 6. While the election is a most important function of our democracy and an essential part of the political process in our American society, it is also a huge opportunity to shape our world according to the teachings of Jesus, the values of the Gospel, and the promotion of justice and peace. How we vote and who and what we vote for ought to be something we weigh in our conscience, that we conscientiously deliberate and decide according to our deeply held beliefs and values, and not just for superficial political reasons. We must vote our conscience. Catholics may legitimately disagree about candidates and issues, but a Catholic voter ought always to listen to his or her conscience, and seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit when making this decision, which has the potential to make our world more just, promote the dignity of the human person and protect human rights.

On another matter, I wanted to let parishioners know that the parish has sold the property we owned at 4124 Longhill Road. This property was once used as the priests' residence, and later as a rental property. The parish Finance Council suggested that this asset was not giving the parish good income as a rental. The Diocese is also in favor of parishes not being "landlords." So this property was sold recently for \$340,000. I have designated \$100,000 of this to be set aside for the future renovations and improvements to St. Andrew School classrooms. Although this "Phase II" of our school renovations is still well in the future, we are already setting aside funds for this purpose.

Finally, I want to thank you for your generosity toward this weekend's special collection for Hurricane Relief. May God bless you all!

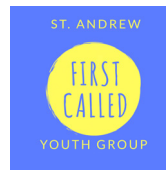

COMMUNAL ANOINTING OF THE SICK – We will have a service for anyone who is ill, receiving medical care, preparing for surgery and would like to

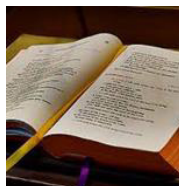
