Dear Parishioners:

Back in September, as you may recall, I asked all parishioners to renew their commitment to the Sunday Offertory, to fill out and return a "Commitment Card" and to continue "Enriching our Faith and Strengthening Our Church." I am very happy to report that we received back 260 commitment cards and pledges. Of these, 57% renewed their existing commitment, and 41% indicated an increased level of giving to the Sunday Offertory. Some of these pledged a significant increase in the level of giving. I am enormously grateful for your very generous response! As I said in my remarks on Commitment Sunday, the support that St. Andrew parishioners provide to the parish has been, and continues to be, consistent and dependable and generous. Because of this, we are less dependent on fund raisers to support regular parish operations. I hope this annual renewal program will further strengthen the relationship you have with your parish while providing the resources needed. St. Andrew Parishioners are the best!
