PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners:

This week on January 22, we once again observe the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. This observance coincides with the anniversary of the 1973 Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion. Ever since this decision, the inalienable Right to Life has been subordinated to the so-called "Right to Choose," with the result that millions of living preborn human beings have been destroyed and their lives snuffed out, and it is perfectly legal. To take a human life in most circumstances is a crime with severe penalties. The lives of preborn humans deserve to be similarly protected, so that this unjust massacre may be halted. I hope you noticed the display of white crosses on the church grounds along Reed Road. Thanks to the Knights of Columbus for placing this silent reminder of the many lives lost because of legal abortion, and for providing this witness to Respect for Life to our community. There is also a more permanent memorial to all those lives lost to abortion since the 1973 *Roe v. Wade* decision: it is a granite marker located in the garden near the Marian grotto outside the northwest corner of the Church. Finally, please take a moment to study the fetal model display in the main vestibule, which shows the developing human features of our unborn human at various stages. May these reminders move us to pray and advocate for the legal protection of unborn children, and the Respect for all human life.

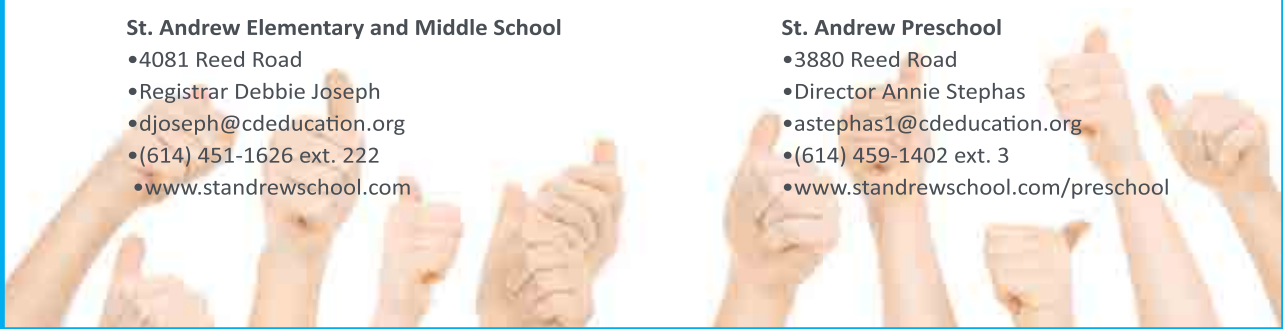
