PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

By now, every parishioner household should have received a copy of the 2019 Stewardship Report for St. Andrew Parish. These were mailed earlier this month. I want to urge you to examine this report carefully. It contains many numbers – but the numbers do not just represent dollars and cents. They represent our parish of St. Andrew, its people, its activities, its good works, its volunteers; those numbers also measure the great commitment you have made to support your parish, and the ministries and services St. Andrew Parish provides to you in return. Please do examine this report and know how grateful I am for your amazing support for the mission of St. Andrew Parish. This will be a good preparation for our annual Offertory Renewal, which will take place in September.

I want to let you know that coming up September 30 through October 3, there will be a Priests' Convocation. Bishop Brennan has asked the priests of the diocese to gather with him for these days of prayer, priestly fraternity, and planning. This is an important event and the priests need this time to be together with our bishop. I bring this to your attention so that you will be prepared for the absence of the priests from St. Andrew during this time, and for the fact that there will be NO MASSES on Tuesday, October 1; Wednesday, October 2; and Thursday, October 3. Additionally, there will be no Adoration and Benediction on Tuesday, October 1.

Speaking of Adoration and Benediction, beginning September 2, we will begin to offer the availability of Confession on the First Tuesday of each month, from 7:30-8:30 p.m., while Adoration is taking place. We will try this for a few months to see if there is interest in this opportunity. It is my hope that people will be interested in the additional opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and that those people will also stay for Adoration, Compline and Benediction, and thus increase participation in Eucharistic Adoration. As a reminder, Eucharistic Adoration takes place each Tuesday beginning at 6:00 p.m. and concluding with Compline (Night Prayer) and Benediction at 8:45 p.m.

Finally, please remember to pray for the Pope's prayer intention for the month of September: "That politicians, scientists and economists work together to protect the world's seas and oceans."

The most recent scam involves the Holy Family Soup Kitchen, which is well known in our Diocese; the Holy Family Food Pantry, and other charitable activities associated with Holy Family Parish and Fr. Stash Dailey. Please do not fall prey to these emails or text messages using Fr. Dailey's name and perhaps tying in with the Holy Family activities, the James Cancer Hospital, etc.

The authorities have been notified, however, we ask that you please not take any action of assistance if you are targeted and receive one of these messages.

SCOUTS POPCORN FOR SALE –

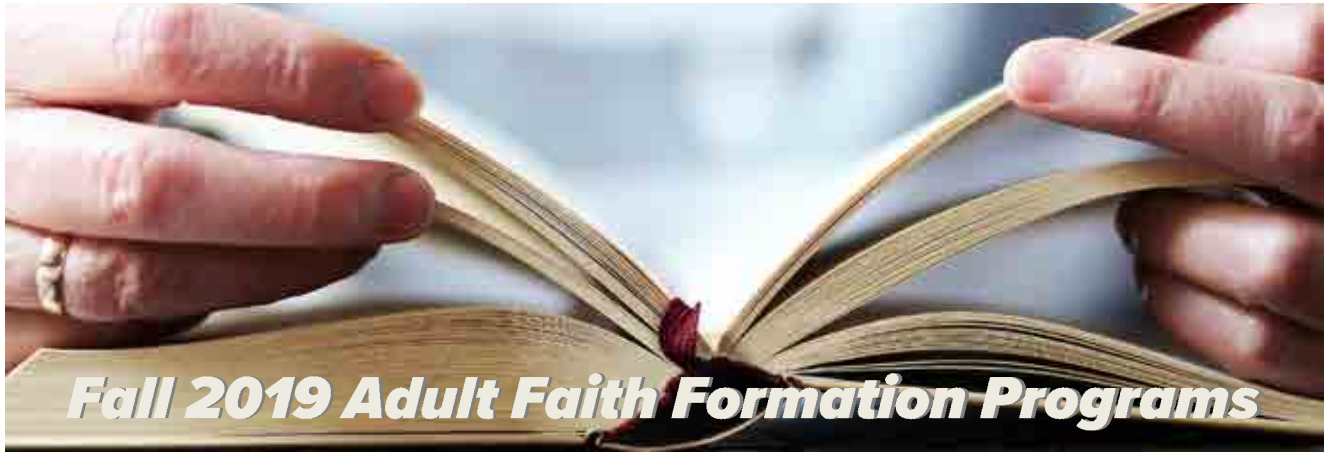
