PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

The weekend, we are conducting our annual offertory pledge renewal. We began this offertory program four years ago with the theme, "Enriching Our Faith, Strengthening Our Church." Back in 2015, St. Andrew Parish needed to increase our revenue from the Sunday offertory, because our collections had fallen off somewhat and not keeping up with our operating expenses. St. Andrew Parish provides many services to our parishioners which truly enrich our faith. But we needed more resources to strengthen our Church to provide all of those services. Parishioners responded enthusiastically to the call to increase their giving and the parish offertory was again robust! Each year since then, I have asked parishioners to examine their giving to St. Andrew Parish and renew their commitment and pledge to the Sunday offertory. And this has kept the revenues adequate to meet our needs over four years. If you looked at the Stewardship Report which was recently sent to all parish households, you will notice that Fiscal year 2018-2019 was another good year! I thank you for your generosity that makes this possible.

In the bulletin each week, you will also see a report on the Sunday offertory collection, which shows the amount collected the past Sunday, as well as year to date, comparison to the budget, and to the same period last year. If you have paid attention to this lately, you will notice that our offertory has fallen behind since the beginning of the fiscal year. The weekly and year to date collection figures are below budget and just equal to last year's actual results for the same period. This is a concern for me, and for you parishioners. So it is very important that on this "Commitment Sunday" all of us make a serious, generous, and intentional commitment and a renewed, enhanced pledge to the St. Andrew offertory, and in doing so contribute to "Enriching Our Faith and Strengthening Our Church." 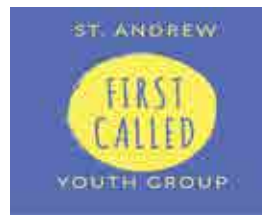
