PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners,

This week marks the sad anniversary of the 1973 Roe vs. Wade decision of the U.S. Supreme Court which legalized abortion in the United States. Since that time, millions of unborn human beings have been unjustly killed and denied the opportunity to continue to live their human life. Wednesday, January 22, the actual anniversary day of that fateful decision, is designated as the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." Every human life is precious and deserves legal protection. The lives of all living persons are sacred.

Every person has the natural right to keep their own life, to continue to live until their life comes to its natural end. Societies protect this right to life by legal protections that punish those who commit murder, manslaughter or homicide. Yet, unbelievably, in our country, the unborn are not protected. This is why we must pray and advocate for the legal protection of unborn children. Let us continue our efforts to change the laws of our nation so that the lives of the unborn will be legally protected.

This week also includes Martin Luther King, Jr. Day on Monday, January 20th. I believe it is a wonderful thing that our country dedicates a national holiday to honor a preacher and a minister of the Gospel. The life of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. teaches us that the message of justice and peace preached in the public square in a non-violent way can truly bring about change.

This week also marks the Feast of St. Francis de Sales, principal patron saint of the Diocese of Columbus. On that day, I hope you will remember to ask God's favor and blessing upon the Diocese and all of our efforts that through the intercession of St. Francis de Sales, the people, the ministries and the services of the Diocese of Columbus may be blessed with success and bear much good fruit!

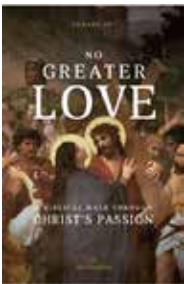

- Be a practicing Catholic (as verified by a letter from a parish leader such as a priest, deacon, or youth minister)
- Active member of St. Andrew, St. Agatha, Our Lady of Victory, St. Christopher. Or an active Catholic living within Upper Arlington, Grandview Heights, or Marble Cliff
- Solid academic performance

The Catholic Foundation's Applications for the Ronald C. Sullivan Scholarship will open on January 31 and close March 30. All other scholarships close on March 2.

The Catholic Foundation is also a proud steward of the **Florence E. Moses Nursing Scholarship**. This scholarship provides tuition assistance to a senior student meeting all the requirements for graduation from a high school in the Diocese of Columbus, Ohio, and that is accepted at and enrolled in the Mount Carmel College of Nursing, as confirmed in writing.
