Dear Parishioners,

February is here! February is probably my least favorite month. It is the shortest month of the year but somehow it seems to last forever, perhaps because it is usually dreary and cold. However, the month of February does offer some great opportunities for us to grow in faith and Christian virtue. I am speaking of the Columbus Catholic Women's Conference on February 15, and the Columbus Catholic Men's Conference on February 22. Both of these events take place at the Ohio Expo Center (the state fairgrounds). The theme of the Catholic Women's Conference is "Amazing Grace," while the Catholic Men's Conference has the theme "Catholic Men of God – Building Virtue." Both events will draw thousands of participants from around the diocese and beyond to hear the inspiring speakers, to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation (dozens of priests will be present at these conferences for this purpose – including me!) and to participate in the Holy Mass celebrated by Bishop Brennan. I want to encourage the men and women of St. Andrew Parish to consider brightening up your February by attending these Catholic conferences. If you do, February might become your favorite "Faith Formation" month.

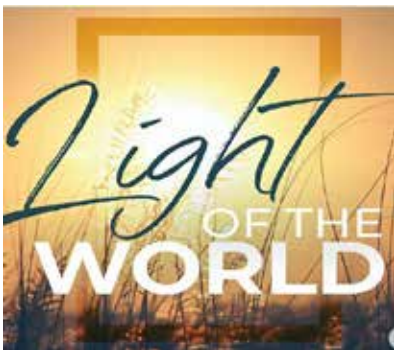

On the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, we reflect on the unique way God chose to free the world from sin and death.

The 2nd reading of the Mass reminds us that by sending His Son, God has given His new chosen people a high priest who is able to complete and perfect the sacrifices of the old covenant by offering His very self.

So firstly, on this day the Church celebrates the entrance of Christ, the new high priest, into His Temple. The sacrifice of this priest will be offered on a cross, and the gifts that He'll offer will be His own flesh and blood.

Secondly, we are invited to take part in an ancient tradition that comes to us from the Eastern churches. Early on, this feast was known as the meeting of Jesus and Simeon, and it was marked by a procession with lights to celebrate "the light of revelation to the nations." This custom was adopted by the Roman Church, and the blessing of candles remains an important ritual for this day. We find this image of light in both the first reading and the Gospel.

The OSU \$25,000.00 Annual Ronald C. Sullivan Scholarship is available through The Catholic Foundation. Applications are being accepted until March 30th.

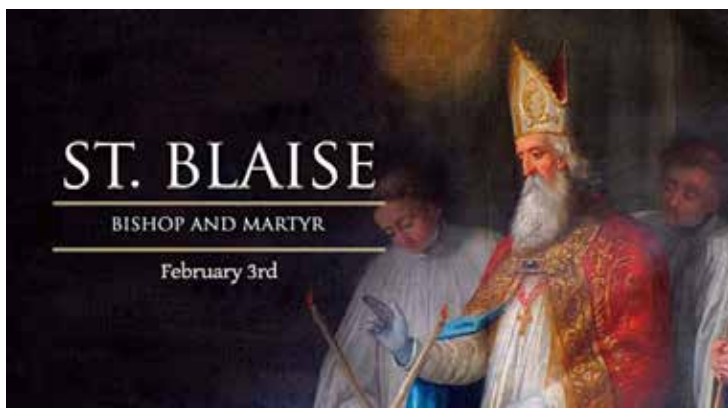

- Solid academic performance

St. Josephine Bakhita

For many years, Josephine Bakhita was a slave but her spirit was always free, and eventually that spirit prevailed. Born in the Darfur region of southern Sudan, Josephine was kidnapped at the age of 7, sold into slavery and given the name Bakhita, which means fortunate. She was resold several times, finally in 1883 to Callisto Legnani, Italian consul in Khartoum, Sudan. Two years later, he took Josephine to Italy and gave her to his friend Augu Asto Michieli. Bakhita became babysitter to Mimmina Michieli, whom she accompanied to Venice's Institute of the Catechumens, run by the Canossian Sisters. While Mimmina was being instructed, Josephine felt drawn to the Catholic Church. She was baptized and confirmed in 1890, taking the name Josephine. When the Michielis returned from Africa and wanted to take Mimmina and Josephine back with them, the future saint refused to go. During the ensuing court case, the Canossian Sisters and the patriarch of Venice intervened on Josephine's behalf. The judge concluded that since slavery was illegal in Italy, she had actually been free since 1885. Josephine entered the Institute of St. Magdalene of Canossa in 1893 and made her profession three years later. She soon became well loved by the children attending the sisters' school and the local citizens. She once said, "Be good, love the Lord, pray for those who do not know Him. What a great grace it is to know God!" The first steps toward her beatification began in 1959. She was beatified in 1992 and canonized eight years later.
