



MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today, we celebrate Palm Sunday, the beginning of Holy Week. These are the days in which our Lord's life-saving death and glorious Resurrection are commemorated, and in which we enter deeply into the Paschal Mystery as we accompany Him from His triumphant entrance into Jerusalem, to His Last Supper with His chosen disciples, to His agony in the garden and His betrayal and arrest. We will continue to follow Him along the Way of the Cross and see Him condemned, mocked, scourged, crowned with thorns and crucified. We will see His body pierced with a lance, then taken down and buried. And we will see His empty tomb and meet Him alive and risen from the dead, and recognize Him in the Breaking of the Bread.

On Palm Sunday, we will wave palm branches as we cry out "Hosanna to the Son of David," and then we will also join the angry crowds who shout "Crucify Him!" And through all the Holy Days of Holy Week, we will be with Jesus as He fulfills the Father's will, as He goes from triumph through tragedy to ultimate victory over sin and death.

This Holy Week is the most sacred time when the central mystery of our faith is made present again and we ourselves enter into that mystery and experience it for ourselves.

Let us keep Holy Week holy. Let us dedicate these days to the solemn commemoration of the suffering, death and Resurrection of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. Let us share in His suffering that we may also share in His glory.




EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Hi boys and girls! My name is "Jackie," and, as you know, I am Father Ferguson's cat! Today is Palm Sunday, and that means it's the start of Holy Week! That's right! This is the most important week of the year! We get to come to church several times and be



with Jesus in a special way as He does so many special things for us. We get to accompany Jesus today during His triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Later this week, we will see Jesus at His Last Supper starting the Holy Eucharist and then being betrayed and arrested on the night of Holy Thursday. Then, on Good Friday, we'll watch as Jesus goes through His trials and Way of the Cross and His Crucifixion. Holy Saturday is when Jesus did His harrowing of Hell to offer salvation to those who died before His time. And then, as He promised, Jesus will do His glorious Resurrection and triumph over Satan on Easter Vigil and also on Easter Sunday.

Wow! That's more action than a cat chasing a bunch of mice all around! Holy Week is a re-living of the reason why Jesus came to Earth in the first place: the life-and-death struggle and epic cosmic battle between good and evil – between God and Satan – so that Heaven could be opened for us once again!

I love Holy Week because so many special things happen at Masses this week. We get palms on Palm Sunday. We watch people get their paws...errrr...their feet washed on Holy Thursday. We see Jesus die on the Cross on Good Friday because of His love for us. And on Easter Vigil (you get to stay up past your bedtime!), we start the Mass in darkness and watch the enormous Easter Candle being lit for the first time. Ask your parents to bring you to all these great events, and see how many different and unusual things you can pick out! Have a "purr"-fect week!



Reflection on Matthew 26:14-27:66

The Palm Sunday Liturgy begins on the upbeat, with Jesus' triumphant, entry into Jerusalem, but dissolves into mayhem as the Passion story unfolds. By hearing today the entire Passion story of Jesus, we are invited to enter into the holiest week of the year, when we will hear and celebrate this same story in its essential parts as we move from Holy Thursday, through Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday.

As we give thanks for God's mercy embodied in Jesus and His great gift of self, we are invited into the story, to allow Jesus' suffering, death and Resurrection to interpret our lives. There is so much here to pause with and reflect on: friendship and betrayal, our personal depths of sinfulness and violence, fear and social pressure, greed and lust for power. As we take ownership of our need for redemption, our individual stories merge with the story of Jesus. We walk the same path together, through death to new life.
