MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

I want to share some information about happenings in the Diocese of Columbus.

In the past few months, the diocese established a "Diocesan Disaster Response Plan," which is a guide "to help parishes, schools, and organizations mobilize people and resources to provide a coordinated and organized response in the event of a natural or man-made disaster anywhere in our diocese." Geographically, we are at a higher risk for disasters such as flooding and tornadoes, but this plan is meant to prepare for all kinds of disasters. Each parish was asked to designate a team to be the point of contact at the parish level. I have designated those people for St. Andrew Parish and our team and I have attended the diocesan training sessions. The diocese also established an emergency fund known as the "Spirit of Hope Disaster Response Fund," which will help support immediate and long-term needs in the event of a disaster. There will likely be an annual collection to support this fund.

On another front, I want to alert you that the Diocese of Columbus is asking us to participate in the "Disciple Maker Index," which is a survey about parish life. You may recall that we participated in the DMI about five years ago as part of the "Real Presence, Real Future" planning process. The Disciple Maker Index will take place during the season of Advent, which begins November 30. I am encouraging you to complete the DMI online as soon as it is available. We will provide information to you over the next two weeks with instructions and a link to the DMI survey. Paper surveys will be available upon request, but I hope you will use the online option for this survey as I consider it more secure and reliable.

WOULD YOU LIKE TO SCHEDULE A HOME VISIT WITH A PRIEST?

If you or a family member are sick, homebound, or hospitalized and would like a visit from a priest, please call the parish office at 614-451-4290 and speak with Msgr. Moloney, ext. 101, or Fr. Tabi, ext. 103. Visits may include reconciliation, Holy Communion, and anointing.

IN AN EMERGENCY: If someone is near death, call the parish office at 614-451-4290 and press 3 (Sacramental Emergency Line). A priest will respond as quickly as possible. If the call comes after business hours or on the weekend, please allow extra time as the priests may be attending to other sacramental needs.

YEAR-END WIN-WIN: Make your retirement savings work twice as hard before year's end. Donors 70½ and older can give up to \$108,000 tax-free from their IRA to a qualified charity like The Catholic Foundation, through a qualified charitable distribution (QCD), lowering your tax bill while building St. Andrew's future through our endowment fund. For those ages 73 or older, QCDs also count toward the required minimum distribution (RMD) for 2025. If interested, keep in mind that IRA rollovers can take up to a month to complete. A RORATE CAELI MASS: St. Mary Magdalene Church will celebrate a Rorate Mass on Saturday, Dec. 6, at 6:30 a.m. A Rorate Caeli Mass is celebrated just before dawn in Advent as a devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Mass is only lit by candles, representing Mary's role in bringing the Light of the World into the darkness of the world. Mass begins in darkness before sunrise, with only candles lighting the church to remind us of a world in darkness and sin that is anticipating the coming of the "Light of the World." As Mass progresses, the church becomes brighter until the risen sun fills it with the light of day. A light breakfast will be served following the Mass. 

THE STORY OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Mary's presentation was celebrated in Jerusalem in the sixth century. A church was built there in honor of this mystery. The Eastern Church was more interested in the feast, but it does appear in the West in the 11th century. Although the feast at times disappeared from the calendar, in the 16th century it became a feast of the Universal Church.

As with Mary's birth, we read of Mary's presentation in the temple only in apocryphal literature. In what is recognized as an unhistorical account, the Protoevangelium of James tells us that Anna and Joachim offered Mary to God in the Temple when she was 3 years old. This was to carry out a promise made to God when Anna was still childless.

Though it cannot be proven historically, Mary's presentation has an important theological purpose. It continues the impact of the feasts of the Immaculate Conception and of the birth of Mary. It emphasizes that the holiness conferred on Mary from the beginning of her life on earth continued through her early childhood and beyond.

REFLECTION

It is sometimes difficult for modern Westerners to appreciate a feast like this. The Eastern Church, however, was quite open to this feast and even somewhat insistent about celebrating it. Even though the feast has no basis in history, it stresses an important truth about Mary: From the beginning of her life, she was dedicated to God. She herself became a greater temple than any made by hands.

God came to dwell in her in a marvelous manner and sanctified her for her unique role in God's saving work. At the same time, the magnificence of Mary enriches her children. They – we – too are temples of God and sanctified in order that we might enjoy and share in God's saving work.


